#### MINUTES OF THE TRAER CITY COUNCIL

The City Council of Traer, Iowa met in regular session on Monday April 5th, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. at Municipal Hall.

## **ROLL CALL**

Mayor Holden called the meeting to order with Council Members, Rausch, Holst, Kennedy, Erhardt and Schafer present.

### APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOTION by Schafer, seconded by Kennedy, that the agenda is approved. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Jared Bauch was present calling the council's attention to all the yard parking in town asking us to review our ordinances and maybe adopt an ordinance requiring concrete pads.

Scott Lycett was also present asking the council to allow 4-wheelers on City streets as permitted vehicles. The ordinance now does not allow 4-wheelers and Scott would like to see that changed.

#### COUNCIL APPOINTMENT

City Clerk Blaine swore in James Erhardt as the interim council person, replacing Steve Foster.

#### **CONSENT AGENDA**

MOTION by Holst, seconded by Rausch, that the minutes of the March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 meeting are approved. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

MOTION by Schafer, seconded by Kennedy, that the March Checks (#29093-29144), totaling \$96,059.18 are approved. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

## STREET PROJECTS

MOTION by Kennedy, seconded by Rausch, approving RESOLUTION 04-05-21-01 Approving Distribution of Preliminary Official Statement. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

### SALE OF CITY PROPERTY

Mayor Holden informed the council that he no longer is looking to purchase the City owned property at this time. He's had another opportunity arise. So at this time, this discussion has been tabled!

## **CONCERNS/COMMENTS/OTHER BUSINESS**

The council discussed renewing their law enforcement contract with the Tama Co. Sheriff's Department. The council was made aware that the only real change to the contract was the 3% increase to the contract amount which covered wage increases and adjustments to FICA/IPERS. MOTION by Holst, seconded by Schafer, to approve renewing a contract with Tama Co. Sheriff's Department, starting 7/1/21, for \$10,388.00 for 200 hours of service per month. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

The Taylor Park Shelter House was discussed and plans submitted by Joe Roy at True Builders were reviewed. The plans reviewed feature a 30' by 60' building to replace the building lost in the derecho. The design features an "open area" end that would be covered by an awning along with a screened in enclosed area, similar to what was there. MOTION by Rausch, seconded by Kennedy, to move forward with the design submitted by True Builders. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

## **DEPARTMENT REPORTS**

Chairman Kennedy informed the council that she had ordered chemical, and starter supplies for the pool. She still has not had any interest in the pool manager position and mentioned may be getting someone at the City office certified to operate the pool as a CPO (certified pool operator), and then hiring a couple other part-time managers to run the day to day. Advertising in local schools and newspapers will be the next step to try to recruit help, but the City might have to look at internal options to get the pool up and running.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
